### Other:

**Risk Assessments regarding people of concern** – The most frequent times for concerns/requests is before mid-term exams and before the end of the semester. If there is an immediate concern for safety, call 911. Otherwise, contact the Police Department administration at 646-4533 for a risk assessment or related assistance. NOTE: The Police Department cannot guarantee that an individual/situation is completely safe. However, it will use select techniques to determine whether or not there appears to be a clear and present danger, and will involve appropriate other offices and resources in addressing any threats that are noted.

**Emergency Action Plan review** – The Police Department will assist departments in reviewing their emergency action plans and may recommend areas for consideration.

**Exercises and Tabletops** – The Police Department will assist major units in the development and conducting of exercises and tabletops specific to their areas.

**[Quick-Flip Guide to Emergencies](#)** – Developed and distributed to all faculty and staff in 2008, these guides provide an easy reference for what to do in many emergencies.

**C-CERT** – The Campus Community Emergency Response Team training incorporates and builds upon the national curriculum in order to develop a group of people who can take charge during an emergency and direct rescue effort until public safety professionals arrive (which may be hours or days, depending on the scale of a disaster). They also receive training that allows them to directly assist the public safety responders with things like crowd management, traffic control, and coordination of volunteers. The program and training are coordinated by the Police Department.
