*WHEREAS, the New Mexico Recycling Coalition leads a campaign for 33 percent recycling by the year 2012; and*



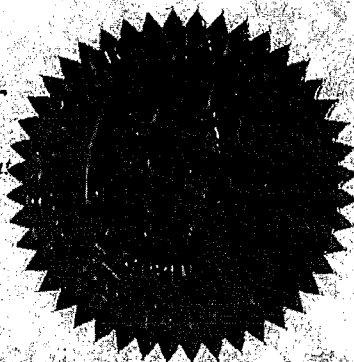
*NOW, THEREFORE I, Bill Richardson, Governor of the State of New Mexico, do hereby proclaim November 15, 2008 as:*

*throughout the State of New Mexico.*


