

**Vice-Chair's Report

***NOTE:** Please remember that any legislation to be considered by Faculty Senate this year needs to be brought forward by the **March 18** meeting of the Committee on Committees (the meeting is early that month due to Spring Break). That will allow the proposition to be introduced at the April Faculty Senate meeting, and voted on at the May meeting. Any legislation that is pending at the end of spring semester automatically dies during the summer.*

Some notes from ADAC:

- The Viewing a Wider World criteria endorsed by Faculty Senate as Prop 11-07/08 have been approved by ADAC. Assuming it's possible for Dean's Council to consider them at their next meeting, and that they also approve them, I expect the criteria to reach us for approval in time for action this year.
- CAHE wants to change the name of the Ph.D. in Agronomy to Ph.D. in "Plant and Environmental Science".

Reorganizing our chapter of the Policy Manual continues. Once again, I'm expecting a complete draft to be available for comment very shortly.
