

Ronald Lucchino, Ph.D., Emeritus Professor of Biology and former Director of the Institute of Gerontology of Utica College of Syracuse University retired in 2003 after 30 years as Professor of Biology. He received his doctorate from university of New Mexico. Dr Lucchino has taught Biology of Aging for over 15 years and the distance learning course Biology Aspects of Aging for 5 years. He is a national recognized expert on Alzheimer's disease and on aging in individuals with Developmental Disabilities. He has made many national and international presentations in the field of age related biological changes.

While at Utica College, Dr Lucchino Developed the Minor in Gerontology, the BS in Gerontology, undergraduate continuing education Certificate in Gerontology, and the WEB based distance learning undergraduate Certificate in Gerontology.

Currently Dr. Lucchino is the Director of Public Policy for the Alzheimer's Association of New Mexico and is project coordinator for a three year Federal grant Infusing Cross-cultural Aging Education Into Allied Health Curriculum of 38 Historically Black Colleges and Universities
